





Following amendments to the Trademark Rules, which came into force in 2017, the Indian Trademark Registry has made substantial progress in clearing its application backlog. Equally positive, India has risen five places to 52nd in the WIPO Global Innovation Index and local IP practitioners report that punitive damages are being awarded more frequently in trademark infringement cases, particularly against habitual offenders. The country is also moving towards greater alignment with the global trademark system, with plans in place to accede to the Nice, Vienna and Locarno Agreements. However, much remains to be done. The Indian market is losing nearly \$14 billion a year to counterfeits, especially in the pharmaceutical industry, according to the Authentication Solutions Providers' Association, while a recent study found that IP awareness among academics is still surprisinglylow.
